Nigel Hatton is an associate professor of literature and philosophy at the University of California, Merced, and a founding member of the University of California Critical Refugee Studies Collective (CRES). He has published articles on the writings of Søren Kierkegaard, Martin Luther King, Jr., James Baldwin, Toni Morrison, Ivan Klima and others. Throughout graduate school and during his faculty appointments, he has simultaneously taught courses in journalism, literature and writing in California State Prisons through the Prison University Project (since 2003) at San Quentin State Prison, and the Prison Education Project (in 2014) at Central California Women's Facility in Chowchilla, Calif.

In his talk, Nigel Hatton will focus on the legacy of the U.S. Civil Rights Movement and discuss the ways in which officials are looking at Europe for answers to the current U.S. prison problem.
